BRINGING CHEER AND SUPPORT, JOY AND GLADNESS

Get ready to be filled with joy! Or as our rabbis teach: “Be happy, it’s Adar!” Over the next few weeks, we are asked, no commanded, to celebrate. This month of Adar centers around Purim, when we commemorate the fall of the evil Haman through songs, drinking lots of alcohol, dressing up, carnivals, and of course, raucous booing! As the snow melts and the cold weather finally pushes us to the edge, it’s wonderful to have the time to let our hair down and just be happy!

Yet, what about those of us who are going through a difficult time? Maybe we don’t feel the best or are taking care of someone who is sick. We might have recently buried a loved one or often remember them at this time of year. Maybe we’re going through a challenge in our personal life or are navigating a difficult relationship. Often, we just don’t feel up to celebrating.

In some ways, our Jewish tradition recognized this quandary. The rabbis made the requirement to be joyous, but they also recognized that some of us might not feel up to it. That’s why they included two additional mitzvot, as part of our Purim celebration: Mishloach Manot, gifts to friends, and Mishloach Aveilim, gifts to the poor. We’re asked to provide small gifts: a few coins, some hamantaschen, cookies, and candy. Personally, I love that we provide gifts to those going through a difficult time, but also gifts to cheer up our friends and family.

That’s the crux of what it means to be a synagogue. As a community, we join together in celebration, yet we should also be there during the dark times as well. Our congregation has been reflecting about how best we can assist each other during moments of challenge. Our Membership Committee is beginning to think about new

ways to connect us to each other. Our Caring Committee reaches out when there’s a death in the family, a new birth, or if someone needs our support. And a small group of congregants will be taking a four-week class on how to care for those in the hospital or who are homebound.

Yet, there is so much more to do! I’m hopeful that we can continue to expand our Caring Committee to think about better ways that we can support each other besides the great work that we are currently doing. In addition, I appreciate you letting us know when someone is ill or going through a difficult time. We often don’t know and always appreciate you or a loved one reaching out and letting us know! Please, continue to let us know with a call, an e-mail, or a text!

As we celebrate this joyous time of year, may our congregation also be by your side during the difficult moments, providing all of us with the strength and peace we need to live each moment to the fullest.

COMMITTEE NEWS

January was a busy month for the Social Action Committee (SAC) membership. We started off the New Year with two MLK weekend events: Councilman Brandon Scott (2nd District, Baltimore City) attended our January 18th Friday night services. We had a good turnout, and he addressed the congregation with a message for all of us to get involved in some way in addressing the many problems facing Baltimoreans, with an important note that in order to work towards change, it will be necessary to face uncomfortable topics such as race and inequality. He then joined us for the Oneg, sponsored by the SAC, and stuck around to talk with many of the congregants and visitors.



The second event was a showing of the film, *Charm City*, at Baltimore Hebrew Congregation on Sunday, January 20th. We were co-hosts for the event together with Jews United for Justice and several area synagogues. It was an amazing turnout, with more than 200 attendees (including over 20 congregants from Bolton Street). The movie, which is about some of the Baltimore communities most affected by violence and drugs, provided an important inside

view of what it means to live and try to thrive and build community in these settings despite the intense adversity. Following the film, Councilman Scott and one of the movie's main stars, Alex Long, spent about an hour answering questions first from a moderator and then from the film attendees as a whole. An important take-away from the movie is that there are local residents who are working hard to make a real difference in some of Baltimore's toughest neighborhoods and we can support them and their groups, and others who are working to make Baltimore a safer and more vibrant city for all of its residents.



The Group of 10 continues to meet and advocate for school funding. Four Bolton Street members who are part of our Group of Ten traveled to Annapolis on January 28th to lobby legislators in support of passing the Kirwan Commission recommendations and an interim funding

proposal. The Kirwan Commission has been working to develop standards for public school education in Maryland plus a funding formula that will fund their proposals. Although they have not completed the funding formula, they have proposed recommendations around early childhood education, college and career readiness, at risk students, high quality teachers and more. Our group teamed with two teachers from Howard County and met with the Howard County delegation as well as Delegate Shelly Hettleman who represents District 11 in Baltimore County, to declare our support for the recommendations and to obtain assurances from the legislators that they also support the plan. There were also impromptu meetings in the halls with Baltimore City legislators as well as others from around the state. Finally, our SAC continues to provide support to the Margaret Brent School and we have some great news to share: we have collected about 300 books for the school! We are still collecting books and are now focusing on middle school books. PLEASE bring them to BSS and put them in the bin in the coat closet area or go to our Amazon wish list to donate at <http://a.co/9Y50Ef6>. Also, thanks to Theresa, Lauren and Steve for assisting with registration and other activities at the January 24th Family Night program. If other Bolton Street Synagogue members are interested, these family nights happen each month and they are always looking for 2-3 volunteers to help out.

BOLTON STREET SYNAGOGUE ANNUAL FUND

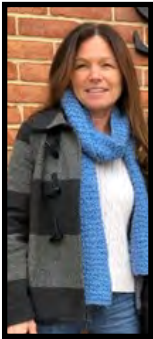
The Bolton Street Synagogue Annual Fund is a yearly initiative where we invite all of our members to make a generous undesignated gift to support our community. TZEDAKAH



We are pleased to bring you a new column in the Chaverim called **Tzedakah** where we highlight a member from our community who has supported Bolton Street through their philanthropy and volunteerism. In this our inaugural piece we introduce you to **Theresa Nicol**.

When Theresa found Bolton Street Synagogue (BSS) in 2003, she was looking for an intimate and welcoming synagogue full of interesting, smart, socially conscious individuals. She wanted to connect with a synagogue that would nurture her family with Jewish tradition and connect with the larger community. Theresa believes that “to belong to a healthy religious community means actively participating and contributing to that community, doing one’s part to keep it vibrant.” For the past sixteen years she has modeled these beliefs for her daughters Evelyn and Audrey, and, as a family, they have strengthened BSS through numerous volunteer responsibilities and philanthropic support. Theresa has been active in a variety of activities at BSS. She initiated and ran Good Deeds Day, she organized monthly community service projects for our teens, and she’s been a committed member of the Social Action Committee.

In addition to her devotion of time, Theresa has supported several synagogue programs with charitable donations. Perhaps closest to her heart is the Madrichim program that engages post B’nai Mitzvah teenagers as Religious School teaching assistants. When Theresa learned that the program was at risk of ending because of a lack of funds, she stepped in with financial support. The Madrichim program was ideally suited to address an issue of concern to Theresa: the vulnerable period following the B’Nai Mitzvah year. Theresa explains, “Our children need a place in a religious community to support continuity - they need encouragement and incentives to stay engaged, to feel that this is a place they can come for connection, with questions, with energy, and to see themselves as role models for younger kids and peers.” We are deeply honored that Theresa has financially sponsored this important program for the past 4 years. “I can’t imagine a better investment of time and money than investing in our BSS community.”
