Sing to Adonai a new song, Sing to Adonai, all the earth, Sing to Adonai, bless God's name ~Psalm 96~

I love services! I've always loved services. Even as a child or in the years before becoming a rabbi, I would attend services "religiously." Yes, I enjoyed being part of a community, but what moved me spiritually (and continues to move me today) is singing. There is something deeply profound when we join our voices together in unison. How often do we sing as one community? We might belt out a few tunes in the shower or roll down the window and raise up our voice in the car, yet rarely do we sing with others. Music and song can spiritually restore the soul and provide us with a deeper connection to the Holy One and to each other.

That's why we've made such a deep commitment to music and singing this year. We've welcomed Cantor Karen Webber as well as a plethora of song leaders, cantors, and local musicians who have joined with us on the bima. With the support of a group of generous congregants, we are able to bring Emily to our community for the High Holy Days AND for one full weekend a month during the 2018 – 2019 year!

Emily Simkin, is a rising fourth year cantorial student at the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion in New York. This past summer, Emily served as Cantorial Student in Residence at Temple Emanu-El in Honolulu, Hl. In the past, she has graced the bima at B'nai Jeshurun in Short Hills, NJ, and at the Jewish Community of Kinnelon, NJ. She's studied Clinical Pastoral Education as a student chaplain and was a B'nai Mitzvah Tutor at Central Synagogue in New York City.

Each month, Emily will lead us in song on Friday evenings and at B'nai Mitzvah services. She'll teach our children, teens, and adults on Sunday mornings. We'll join together for Saturday morning alternative services, Havdalah events, and holiday celebrations. It will be quite a year!

High Holy Days Parking



Loyola shuttle busses will leave every 15 mins. for the synagogue, with travel time of 5 mins. Shuttles will be marked "Cathedral-Newman" and will drop off and pick up Bolton Street Guests at Newman Towers, a very short walk from BSS.


